

Cloud Computing


Defined as: Systems deployed using an offsite model where the computer servers and the software are supplied as a service rather than as enterprise licenses to lower IT costs.


Business Intelligence


Security


Unified Communications


Mobile Workforce


Collaboration Techniques




IT Management


Customer Relationship Management


Computing Infrastructure


System Integration


Investigator Portal


EDC - Electronic Data Capture


CTMS - Clinical Trial Management System


IVRS - Interactive Voice Response System


LIMS - Laboratory Information Management System


DMS - Document Management System



EDMS - Data Management System


EDMS -- My company will deploy a data management system to manage clinical trial data.


ePRO -- My company will deploy an electronic patient reported outcomes system

Repository -- My company will deploy a corporate clinical repository to store all clinical trial data in a single repository.


